November Program by Sarah Eichenberger piques interest in beading

At the November HAG meeting Sarah Eichenberger demonstrated how she makes bracelets with beads, leather and fancy buttons. She lists the components for the bracelets she makes and adds advice in using these:

Leather cord: 1.5mm or 2mm sizes (I've used smaller but it's not recommended)

Beads: seed beads 6/0 (I think 6/0 might pertain to hole size, but I'm not positive.) Or any beads with a hole big enough for the needle.

Needles: I'm currently using an embroidery needle my mom gave me. The eye needs to be big enough for the thread and small enough for the bead!

Thread: Irish Waxed Linen in 2ply is my preferred, but 3ply is just fine (and black and brown only

come in 3ply and above!)
Buttons: preferably between 16mm and 20mm size shank buttons. Can use other buttons (or whatever you think might work) as long as the leather cord can fit through the hole.

I also use a clipboard to keep my bracelet in place as I work on it. And a paper towel to keep the clipboard from cutting into the leather cord. (pretty fancy)
