FIRST FRIDAY ART CLASSES:

The Harbor Art Guild sponsors a free art class during the First Friday Art Walk each month at Aberdeen Art Center. The teaching artist guides students through beginner-friendly projects in the Art Center classroom, with space limited to 16 students. The classes are free to the public. Some supplies are available at the gallery for use, with the teacher supplying any remaining materials needed. The classes may include any art form. Pre-registration is recommended as some classes have had a waiting list. Each artist sets up their own method for registration. Classes are listed on the Aberdeen Art Center's website calendar at www.harborartguild.com. The Guild pays a stipend of \$100 to the artist for each class.

The Guild is so lucky to have member **Marshelle Backes**. She has taken the lead in providing such a fun event for our community and steps in each month when no one else is teaching. The Guild is grateful! If you didn't know, Marshelle is also the founder of *Paint · Laugh · Repeat*, which provides "sip and paint" type gatherings. The Art Center classes are a fun way to bring in people who might not normally come to a gallery opening and expands our circle of art enthusiasts in Grays Harbor. Because this class builds enthusiasm for art, many of those early students have now become regular attendees. *All Harbor Art Guild artist are invited to teach*.
