We are fortunate in the Pacific Northwest to be within a day's roundtrip drive to three great art museums: Portland Art Museum, Tacoma Art Museum and Seattle Art Museum. Each has a website with information on current and future shows but here is a brief listing of what each is offering.

The **Portland Art Museum**, at 1219 SW Park Avenue, Portland <<http://portlandartmuseum.org/>>, features posters by Corita Kent in a show called *Spiritual Pop* until January 29, 2017.

Tacoma Art Museum, at 1701 Pacific Avenue, Tacoma <<http://www.tacomaartmuseum.org/>>, has a new show coming: *The Outwin 2016: American Portraiture Today*, running February 4 - May 14, 2017.

"From the Smithsonian's National Portrait Gallery comes a showcase of today's most commendable American portraits, the finalists from the triennial Outwin Boochever Portrait Competition."

The main **Seattle Art Museum** is at 1300 First Ave Seattle, WA 98101, <<http://www.seattleartmuseum.org/>>. The Asian Art Museum and the Olympic Sculpture Park are also part of SAM.

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of the birth of one of Seattle's most beloved artists, Jacob Lawrence, SAM presents *Jacob Lawrence: The Migration Series*. It will run Saturday, January 21 to Sunday April 23, 2017.

A native of Grays Harbor, Doug went to college in California after graduating from Grays Harbor College. He began his career as a graphic designer, met his partner, David Rodriguez, and they opened a restaurant as well as many other artistic pursuits.

From the oil painting set his mother gave him at age 14 he began teaching himself to be an artist. Inspired by his mother's cooking whatever she found in the fridge, Doug creates assemblage art from found objects.

With his return to Grays Harbor in 2014, he is making Aberdeen more attractive with his murals: the hands and historic photos across from the Morck Hotel and the work in progress featuring bubbles on the side of the D&R Theatre. Doug is relentless in his pursuit of art and we are glad he is a guild member.

Two solo shows replace New Ventures Show


