Featured Artist: JENNY FISHER

Member artist **Jenny Fisher** was born in southern California and studied art in college in California and Oregon. She and her husband moved to Grays Harbor in 1985 to raise their children in this small community. Jenny established herself as a local mural artist through Washington State's 1989 Bicentennial mural project, painting a Native American river scene on Central School in Hoquiam. She has painted dozens of public and private murals in Grays Harbor since that Bicentennial project. We have all seen and deeply appreciated her local murals, which include: "Kelp Forest" at City Center Drug; "Charcuterie", The Market Place; "The Books of Youth", Hoquiam Timberland Library; "The Immigrants, Grays Harbor 1848 -1915", Union Gospel Mission, Aberdeen; and "A History of Shipping in Grays Harbor", Billy's Restaurant, Aberdeen. Jenny also enjoys sign painting for businesses and other calligraphic and font work. Jenny also plays guitar and sings!

Jenny's early influences were Vincent Van Gogh and Aubrey Beardsley: Van Gogh taught her color relationships while Beardsley taught her the grace of fine line drawing. Now Jenny's inspiration comes "from everything everywhere." She works in watercolor, stained glass, leather; and wood and stone carving. She also sews, though she says she is a "half-assed seamstress."

Jenny says that she was always the 'artist' in whatever group she was in whether it be in school, with family, or in a work environment. As a kid she found solace and wonder in immersing herself in art. Nothing's changed.
